

# Integrated Population and Coastal Resource Management (IPopCoRM) Project



PROCESS-Bohol was chosen by the Partnership for Appropriate Technology on Health (PATH) Foundation to implement the Integrated Population and Coastal Resource Management (IPOPCoRM) Project in the province of Bohol with funding support from Lucille Packard and USAID. It was designed to enhance food security and quality of life of rural coastal communities through provision of technical and financial assistance. The project focused on three objectives: improved reproductive health for people living in coastal communities; enhance community management of coastal resources and increased awareness of population-environment issues and linkages.



## Bohol Marine Triangle (BMT) Project



The year 2002 marked a re-crossing of paths between PROCESS-Bohol and FPE, when the duo implemented a project on "Biodiversity Conservation and Management of the Bohol Marine Triangle (BMT) Islands". Aply called BMT project and funded by the UNDP, its intention was on safeguarding the remaining rich and diverse species of flora and fauna emanating in the coastal waters of Panglao, Daus and Baclayon.



PROCESS worked on the ground level in one island barangay of Baclayon and 4 barangays of Daus tapping and re-strengthening of existing peoples organizations.
