

Katarungan Network on Water Nourishment (KNOWN) Project

The KNOWN Project was successfully completed early in 2007. The Project set up 12 Jetmatic pumps and 4 Malawi hand pumps in Barangay Katarungan, Ubay. These Level I waterworks systems serve 186 households, directly benefiting 1,050 individuals and one elementary school.

The Project also facilitated the registration of the Carabao Raisers Association (CARA) with the Department of Labor and Employment and organized a water management committee for each community left in charge of a pump.

Ecological Sanitation (Ecosan) Project



While others appear to be apprehensive about ecosan or ecological sanitation, the village folks of Barangay San Pedro in the municipality of Talibon, Bohol welcome the latrine project with open arms.

The ecosan toilet is a waterless type of sanitary latrine. The user will use ash instead of water. The ash will help kill the pathogens present in the feces and control the odor. The hot temperature trapped inside the vault from sunlight will also deprive the bacteria of water supply to sustain life and will push the hot air upward through the vent above the roof.



The project is implemented in partnership with the Bol-anon United Sectors Working for the Advancement of Community Concerns (BUSWACC), Inc., Peace and Equity Foundation (PEF) and the San Pedro Resource Management Association (SPRMA).
